CHOIR AUDITIONS FOR SEPTEMBER 2018

It is that time of year again where we begin recruiting for our school choir again. To join the choir, all children will require an audition as well as experience being part of a choral group. They must also be prepared to show commitment for a whole academic year and demonstrate a mature standard of behaviour, as there is an expectation to work towards performances, both in school and externally. It is a real privilege to be part of our choir and it is important that your child understands the dedication and hard work required throughout the year. Additionally, we will be participating in Young Voices again in January 2019 and this is not an opportunity to be missed!

If your child is interested in joining our choir and would like to audition, please complete the slip at the end of this newsletter. Auditions will take place from the first rehearsal and throughout the first half of the Autumn. This will enable them to gain the necessary experience of being part of a choral group and to ensure that the choir is a suitable activity for them. Rehearsals will start on TUESDAY 18th September 2018 and will continue throughout the Autumn Term at this time. After the Young Voices concert, rehearsals are likely to take place at lunch times but I will keep all of you informed. Children must attend every week.

Nottingham Music Service's Area Band Network: has proven to be very successful in the last decade in helping many city pupils move on from the beginner stage and start playing in a band. The ensembles equip children with the skills and confidence to continue learning their instruments from Year 5. Each year, the programme is getting bigger and better.

While this is good news on one hand, the cost of running the programme has increased for the Music Service. Therefore, in order to maintain the high standards, the Music Service have decided to start charging a small annual fee of £25 per child (£20 concessions) to join an Area Band this year.

Area Band will take place at Haydn School in Sherwood and transport to the venue will be funded by school. Rehearsals will be every Wednesday from 4pm-5pm; after the rehearsal, children will return to school by 5.30pm.

If your child is interested in joining an Area Band, please complete the slip at the end of the Newsletter and return it to the office as early as possible next week (W/C. 10th September). If you have any questions, please speak to Miss Dickson.
