We look forward to seeing as many of you there as possible. On Friday 16th November we will be also be holding a **BOOK SWAP** so if you have a book at home which you have read and read and fancy a change, bring it to school next week and by donating some money to Children in Need, you can take a different book home to enjoy.

There will also be a 'How well do you know your authors?' book quiz, which we hope many of you will participate in. All entries will receive a £1 book token that can be redeemed against any book that you decide to purchase from Scholastic. Additionally, all quiz entries will be collected and the children with the most correct answers will be entered into a prize drawer. <u>School Dinners</u>: Children in our Reception and KS1 classes are eligible under the Universal Infant Free School Meals scheme to have a free school meal.

Children, who are in the Nursery and Years 3, 4 and 5 unless eligible to Free School Meals, will need to pay for school dinners. The current price is £1.95 per meal meaning that the weekly cost is £9.75. If you think you may be receiving a qualifying benefit you can get a form from the office to apply for Free School Meals.

<u>Midday Supervisor Vacancies</u>: Come and join our team! We currently have Midday Supervisor vacancies across both campuses to work one hour and 25 minutes per day with an hourly rate of £8.50 per hour. If you or anyone you know is interested in these positions please collect an application form from either school office.
