A confirmation letter will be sent out to you to confirm your child's place.



<u>School Dinners</u>: Children in our Reception and KS1 classes are eligible under the Universal Infant Free School Meals scheme to have a free school meal.

Children, who are in the Nursery and Years 3, 4 and 5 unless eligible to Free School Meals, will need to pay for school dinners. The current price is £1.95 per meal meaning that the weekly cost is £9.75. If you think you may be receiving a qualifying benefit you can get a form from the office to apply for Free School Meals.
