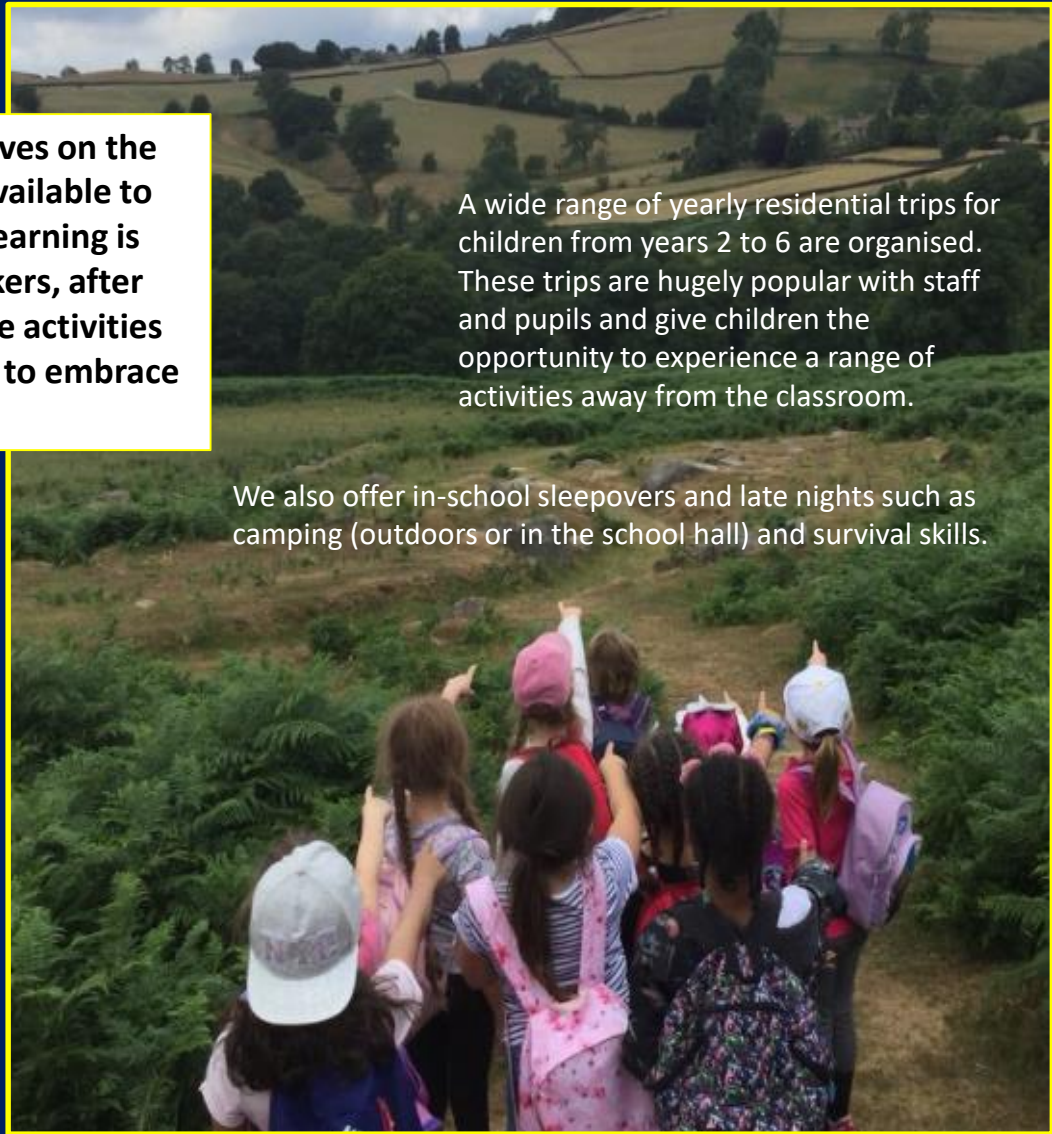
The Heathfield Pledge

Our Curriculum

At Heathfield Primary and Nursery we pride ourselves on the wide range of enrichment opportunities that are available to the children. Throughout every Key Phase pupils' learning is enhanced by a variety of trips, visitors, guest speakers, after school clubs and residential visits. We believe these activities play a key role in a child's development and we try to embrace new opportunities whenever possible.



A wide range of yearly residential trips for children from years 2 to 6 are organised. These trips are hugely popular with staff and pupils and give children the opportunity to experience a range of activities away from the classroom.

We also offer in-school sleepovers and late nights such as camping (outdoors or in the school hall) and survival skills.
