Reminder: INSET day on Friday 20th December: Children will finish for the holidays next Thursday 19th **December.** Staff will be in for training on Friday 20<sup>th</sup> December so school will be closed to all pupils. We re-open on Monday 6th January 2020. There is another INSET day on Friday 24th January.

EYFS Christmas Crafts and Songs: On Tuesday 17th December children in Jellyfish, Turtles and Octopus classes will be having their Christmas Crafts and Songs morning. Parents of Jellyfish morning and full time children can come at 8:45am, parents of Jellyfish afternoon children can come at 2:15pm. Jellyfish full time parents/carers can also attend the afternoon session if they were unable to attend the morning one.

Christmas Parties: Next week will see our Christmas Parties taking place in the afternoons on the following dates:

- Monday 16th December: EYFS Party (Jellyfish, Turtles and Octopus) Morning Jellyfish children are invited to join us in the afternoon for the party from 1:30pm-3:15pm. Parents do not need to stay with them and any children who are coming in the afternoon can come into school already in their party clothes, this also includes afternoon Jellyfish children.
- Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> December: KS1 Party (Hedgehogs, Owls, Squirrels and Rabbits)
- Wednesday 18th December: KS2 Party (Peacocks, Eagles, Pelicans, Falcons, Pumas and Leopards)

All children can bring their party clothes in a named bag to change into before their party starts. Normal uniform is required during the morning of their party.

Save the Children CHRISTMAS JUMPER DAY

Christmas Jumper Day: On Thursday 19th December we are having our Christmas Jumper Day to raise money for Save the Children. You don't need to get a new jumper, you can decorate your ordinary boring jumpers or swap an old one with a friend. Normal uniform (apart from the jumper) is still to be worn on this day. Please send your child with a £1 donation to raise money to help change the future for children.

Songs Around the Tree: This will take place at 9am on Thursday 19th December. Please enter the hall by the side door from the KS1 playground, rather than through the main entrance. As stated in the previous newsletters, the tickets for Songs Around the Tree were limited due to there being over 280 children in the hall and therefore ensuring fire regulation safety. We apologise if you were unable to get a ticket on this occasion. There will be no entry to the event without a ticket.

Songs Around the Tree 2020: We are reviewing plans in light of the popularity of the KS1 performance and so next year's Songs Around the Tree will just be for our KS2 children. These decisions are part of our ongoing adaptation to being a growing school. We still have to grow by 2 more classes so we may still have to make changes to our calendar of events but as always we will keep you notified through this newsletter and our text messages.

Last minute Stocking Fillers: Jo has a little stall in the office where you can buy ready wrapped Cadbury selection boxes for £1.50 and a Fortnite book for £3. All stock must go!

<u>Christmas Dinner:</u> Your child should have come home earlier this week with a copy of the Christmas dinner menu which will be on **Thursday 19**<sup>th</sup> **December**. The menu for this day will also be displayed on the outside board and around the school.

Don't forget that all children in KS1 are eligible under the Universal Infant Free School Meals scheme to have a free school meal. The cost for children in full time nursery and KS2 unless entitled to free school meals is £2.15.

Please note if your child does not have a Christmas dinner on this day a packed lunch will have to be provided from home.

So that we can provide the kitchen with meal numbers if you have not yet done so please complete and return the slip attached by Monday. Even if your child is free schools meals please complete the slip so we can provide the kitchen with as accurate numbers as possible.

As a result of Christmas dinner day being on a Thursday we will be changing Wednesday's menu so that it isn't a roast dinner day. The menu for Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> December will be a choice of either fish and chips or pizza and chips.

<u>Year 3 and 4:</u> Children in Peacocks, Eagles, Pelicans and Falcons will be coming home today with a letter about a trip to the Nottingham Playhouse on **Friday 10**<sup>th</sup> **January 2020** to see the panto 'Sleeping Beauty'

Festive Feedback: Following the success of the Key Stage 1 performance on Thursday and in light of the events coming up next week, I wanted to share this which I found on Twitter. (a) (Not a parent at Heathfield)

This morning I went to see my daughter and her classmates in their Christmas performance and I remain convinced that teachers are expertly programmed machines who plug themselves into a charging station once their classes leave each day. They managed over 120 children on that stage this morning. 120! Every child knew what to do and when to do it. They were a dazzling, electric bunch of eager happy little faces who gave it their absolute all and whole thing was slick, fast-paced and professional.

Meanwhile, at home, my children are incapable of flushing a toilet. And I won't even mention the trauma of having them put on their own shoes in the mornings. I can't imagine the work that goes into these things by the teachers.

Next time you're sitting at your desk sipping a coffee and tapping at your keyboard thinking you're stressed, ask yourself whether your boss interrupts you at random intervals throughout the day to ask you to tie their shoe laces.

And next time you have a deadline to meet and feel gravely hard done by, consider how you'd feel if the co-workers you were relying on for help asked to go to the toilet 45 times an hour and repeatedly came sobbing to you with stories of how someone had made off with their favourite coffee mug.

It takes a very special person to be a teacher. I would challenge any of the overpaid politicians in this country to be able to put on a Christmas play involving 120 children with only a couple of weeks to prepare and produce such a wonderful, inclusive show by the end.

Our staff do work incredibly hard at this time of year to ensure that you have memories which last a lifetime. The staff are not trained actors, directors, sound engineers, costume makers, conductors of choirs or set designers yet each year a fantastic show is prepared in limited time for all children in Key Stage 1.
