



Rub a balloon on your head, then watch a soda can race across the floor!



What do I need?

- empty soda can
- blown-up balloon
- your hair




What do I do?

Put the can on its side on table or the floor - anyplace that's flat and smooth. Hold it with your finger until it stays still.









5 If you move the balloon to the other side of the can, the can will roll in the other direction.



6 How fast will the can roll? How far can you roll it before the can stops? Will it roll uphill?

If you have some friends with cans and balloons, you can have a race across the room or down the sidewalk.

Shadow Experiment: Choose a sunny day. Put something in your garden or drive way. If you have chalk it can be something big, but if you don't just use something smaller and put it at the top of a piece of paper. Every hour go out and draw around the shadow that it makes. What do you notice?

Have a go at Long Jump Warm up by running on the spot for 30 seconds then doing 10 star jumps, run again and then do 10 squats, run again and then sprint on the spot and count down from 10. Mark your starting place by stretching out a skipping rope, laying down a stick or stretching out a jumper. (Leave enough space - about 5 giant steps - for a run up to your starting place.) Start your run up and jump forwards as far as you can. Land on BOTH feet and mark your landing place by laying a coloured pencil or pen close by. Have a short rest and think about what you could do to improve on your distance. Could you jump with more height? Could you lean forward at take off?
