Read a book! Can you act it out with some homemade puppets or toys?	Can you create your own medicine like George's Marvellous Medicine? What is the most disgusting ingredient you can find?	Chose a number and write a story about that number. "The number four needed some bread and milk so he went to the shop..."	Chose some objects from around your house. Are they waterproof or not? Can you test it out?	Can you draw a portrait of everyone in your family? Take your time and concentrate on each part of their face
Try some new food! Can you try something you have never tried before? Describe the taste and texture.	Write your own book. Can you write a story or non-fiction book to share with your family?	Can you create a piece of art using things you have found outside? Sticks, leaves, petals, stone etc?	There is an edible garden in Willy Wonka's factory. Can you create something edible that doesn't look like it should be?	Can you draw your own jigsaw then challenge someone to piece it back together again?
Can you pick 5 different objects and order them in different ways - their weight, their height their width... Are they all the same order?	How many footprints do you need to measure a room in your house?	Can you grow a sunflower? Keep measuring the sunflower to see how high it can grow!	Draw around different parts of your body and colour them in with different patterns while listening to peaceful music.	Can you research some poems and try to memorise your favourite one?
Can you learn to tie shoelaces? If you already know how, can you teach someone else?	Find a world map. How many countries can you name on the map? Can you research the ones you do not know?	Can you collect things from your garden and create some artwork?	Read through your favourite book. Can you make it even better? Can you add adjectives and conjunctions?	Watch some clips of Cosmic Yoga, can you chose your favourite moves and create your own routine?
Can you design and make a different rainbow style to hang in your window?	Write a letter or card to someone who may be at home alone.	Can you draw a map of where you live? Think about the different roads and the things you might see on a map.	Describe different objects to members of your family. Can they guess what you are describing?	Place 10 things on a tray. Ask someone to memorise the items and then take one away. Can they figure out which object is missing?



Home Learning Activity Ideas



Become a playwright just like Shakespeare! Write your own play inspired by your favourite story.	Perform your play to your family. Can you design tickets and write a programme for the performance?	Learn to say 10 things in Spanish. Can you teach them to another family member too?	Talk to your parents and grandparents about their childhoods. How has the UK changed since Roald Dahl's books were written?	Create your own dance routine. Add a different action every day and see how long you can make your routine!
Create a Nature Bingo card filled with different things – daisies, branches etc. See if you can spot everything on your card on your walks.	Create a leaflet telling visitors from different countries all about the UK.	Use recycled materials to make your own chocolate factory model. Can you make puppet characters too?	Find different things in your house and sort them by their material. How would you describe each material?	Write a letter to say thank you to the people that bring your post or collect your rubbish.
Create a timetable of activities for one afternoon. Use the clock to keep you on schedule. Can you tell the time to 5 minutes?	Create a text map of your favourite story. Perhaps you could rewrite the story and change some parts?	Play Simon Says to practise following detailed instructions. Can you practise your left and right or turning clockwise?	Become an actor! Use things around the house to dress up as Roald Dahl's different characters.	Practise your spellings in an interesting way. Can you cut out paper letters or draw letters in the soil?
Listen to some different genres of music – pop, classical, jazz. How are they different? Which do you like the best?	Mindfulness Look out of the window and play I Spy with a family member. Who can spot the most unusual things?	Become the teacher! Teach your family something you have learnt at school – like how to perform a text map or how to divide.	Challenge your family to a Times Tables Championship. Who is the quickest at recalling their times tables?	Become a poet like Roald Dahl! Write your own acrostic poem using the word 'SUMMER'.
Become a writer like Roald Dahl! Think about your favourite book and write what happens next.	Check a shopping receipt and work out how much money was spent. Which coins could they have used to pay with?	Create some artwork inspired by different countries' flags. Can you find out about each country too?	Create a 3D map of your street using objects to represent houses, shops etc. Don't forget to label what each object represents!	Get a family member to help you to create your family tree.

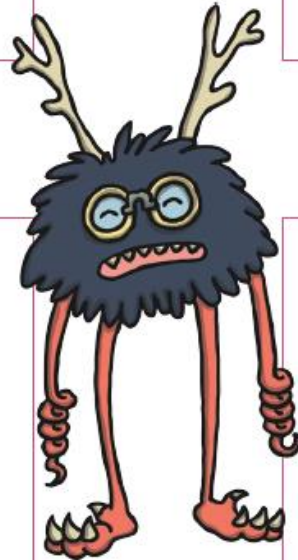
