

This week's theme was Enterprise so we have been thinking about our own business ideas.


On Monday our enterprising ideas were based around the theme of food. We calculated the cost of some dishes in Maths and ensured that they would make a restaurant £3 profit. We then thought of our own new dishes and carried out some market research to find out which ideas were popular. In English we wrote instructions of how to make our new dish. We designed our own restaurant and menu, making sure we thought about an interesting theme.





On Tuesday we designed our own theme park; we created it from paper in Art and wrote a persuasive advert for our park in English. We investigated forces in Science, solved theme park Maths questions and researched current rides.

On Wednesday we focused on video games. We used data to help us with market research, wrote some code and character dialogue for games. We found out about circuits in computers and designed our own game packaging.



<u>Next Week:</u> Our Dolphin children will be returning to school on Monday. They children will be in 'bubbles' of no more than 10 children and will be eating their lunch in their classroom to avoid mixing with other year groups in the hall.
