

Set 3 Phonics Home Work Pack

Dear Parents/Carers

This booklet covers some of the sounds that we were working on before lockdown.

Please use these resources to support your child's reading.

Each day work on a new sound and revisit any from previous days. This only needs to take about 15 minutes. There are 2 books for your child to read to you which focus on two of the sounds covered please read these a couple of times each over 2 or 3 days.

Listening to your child read

- Do not read the book aloud before your child reads it to you
- Ask your child to read the Story Green words and the Tricky read words before reading the story
- Encourage your child to sound out the words that they can't read automatically
- Read back each sentence or page to keep the plot moving (your child's energy is going into reading words not the story)
- Keep it light and fun

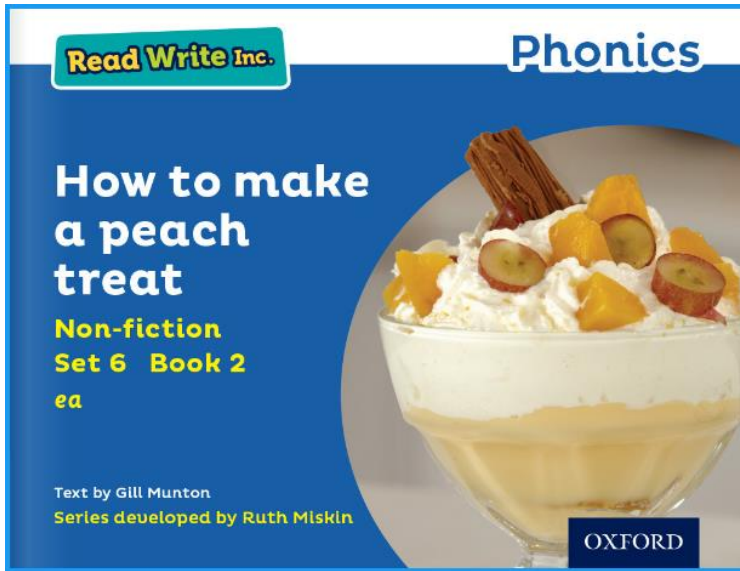

Red Words

Read this book and see how you can make a peach treat.



It's cheap to make and it's a real feast!

Make lots of peach treats for your next birthday party!

You need:

- some cake
- a carton of custard
- a can of dairy cream
- some grapes
- a tin of sweet peaches
- a chocolate flake.



Now follow the 7 easy steps.

- 1 First, take a chunk of cake. Put it in a clean glass bowl. This will make the base of your peach treat.



- 2 Now take 4 scoops of custard. Put the custard on top of the cake.




- 3 Put a big blob of dairy cream on top of the custard.

- 4 Take the pips out of the grapes and put the grapes on top of the cream.



- 5 Chop up the peach and put the bits on top of the cream with the grapes. Heap them up.

Ask an adult to help you with opening the tin of peaches and with cutting. 



- 6 Finish off the peach treat by sticking a chocolate flake in the cream.



- 7 Now take your seat for a real treat! Eat it with a spoon.

Peach treats are so cool!

What sort of bowl do you need?

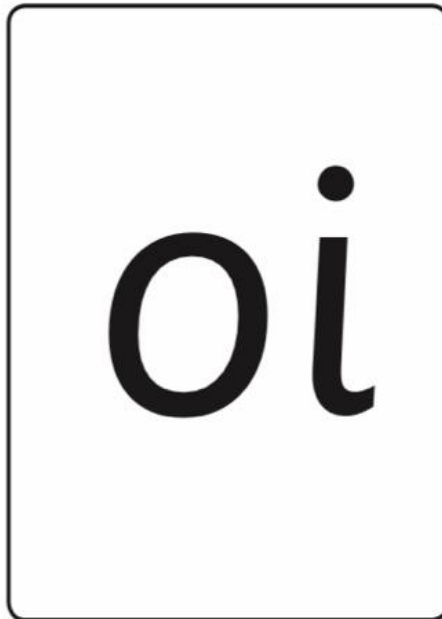

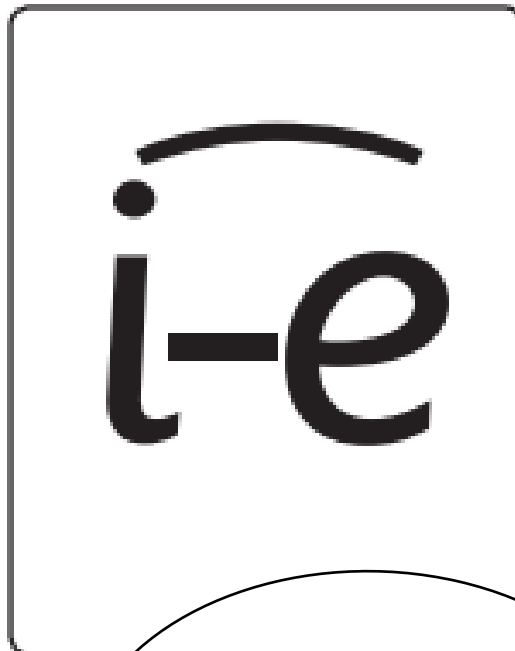
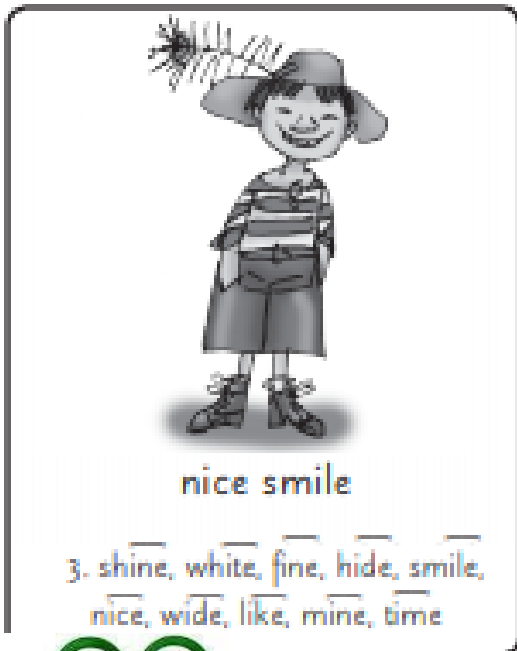

Follow the guidelines!

Your bike

Before you ride your bike, check:

Your bike must be the right size – not too big and not too small.

front light

bell

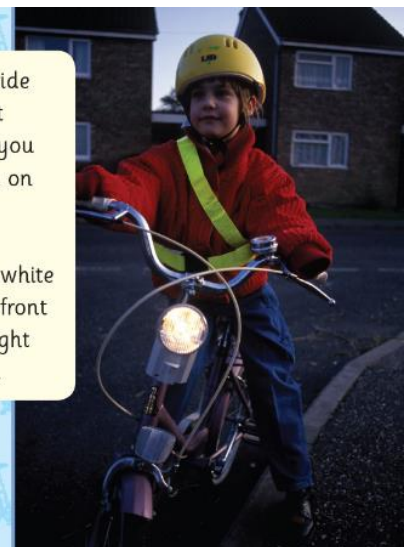
brakes

back light



When you ride your bike at night time, you must switch on your lights.

You need a white light at the front and a red light at the back.



How to dress

Put on shorts or tight trousers.

No long skirts or wide trousers – they might get trapped in the wheels.



You can get a helmet for quite a low price.

Check that your helmet fits well.

Put on your helmet each time you ride your bike.



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How to ride your bike

Ride at the side of the street, next to the pavement.

Do not ride your bike on a street with lots of traffic.



Do not ride your bike in ice and snow. Your wheels might slip and slide.

Choose a fine day for your bike ride.



Don't forget – be safe when you ride your bike!
