Masked Reader

At some point during World Book Day, your child's class teacher will schedule a meeting with a masked reader! Can children work out who is reading the story before they reach the end? Check your child's Teams account for details of the meeting.

Heathfield Favourite Books

A questionnaire will be sent home and will ask what your child's favourite books are. We'll create a top 10 and share with everyone at the end of the day!



Toilet Roll Dress-Up

Many children at home may still choose to dress up as their favourite book character on WBD. However, this is an alternative which won't cost a fortune! Children can decorate a toilet roll tube (or any other household item!) to represent a book or character. Please bring these into school when we reopen on the 8th! The best ones will go on display.
