All pupils are expected to achieve the attendance target of at least 97% Attendance Attendance Matters All pupils are expected to attend school every



day that it is open

- Parents need to inform school of their child's absence by 9.20am
- If school has not been informed of the reason of a child's absence, then the absence will be recorded as unauthorised
- If a child is absent for 3 or more days, an attendance lead may carry out a home visit

Families taking a holiday during term time are at risk of legal action and/or a Penalty Notice being issued

- The Education (Pupil Registration) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2013 state that schools can no longer grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances
- Holidays do not fit into the criteria of an exceptional circumstance
- There are 13 weeks within the academic year that children do not attend school; it is the expectation that holidays, family visits/gatherings and appointments are booked within these periods
- It is the school's policy that holidays and time off to visit family during term time is recorded as unauthorised and this is the view of the Full Governing Body
- Leave of absence requests to attend a family wedding will only be granted for the day of the ceremony

Poor attendance is considered a safeguarding concern.

Please help us to get all pupils into school very day and on time!

<u>Warm weather guidance</u>: Children should have a **WATER** (NOT juice) bottle with them in school as drinking fountains remain turned off. Children should also have a hat and be protected by sun cream. If the weather turns hot and sunny and your child is not suitably protected from the sun, they will not be able to go out to play especially over the long lunchtime break for their safety.



Effort Score Badges: At Heathfield all children's work is awarded an effort score by their class teacher or the person providing feedback. This is a score of 1 to 5, based on the child's individual ability, to show how much effort they have put into the piece, with 1 being the lowest (this doesn't happen very often) and 5 being the highest. Children who really push themselves to produce the best work they possibly can are awarded a 5 and can then take their work to Mr Hicks and choose one of our prestigious '5 for Effort' badges, that have been designed by the pupils. They can then wear these on their uniform to show everyone how hard they have worked.

It would be great if you could talk to your child about their effort scores to find out how they are doing in class, especially if they have been awarded a badge, and to discuss what they could do to improve their scores.

EU settlement Scheme – Information from the Government Home Office: With the EU Settlement Scheme (EUSS) application deadline (30th June) fast approaching, the Home Office would like to remind parents, families, young people and staff that if you are an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen, you and your family members may be eligible to apply to the Settlement Scheme.

It is crucial that eligible parents apply to the Scheme yourselves and check whether you need to do so on behalf of your children. Eligible children are required to have an application in their own right and no child of any age is covered by a parent's application to the EUSS. There's more information on this here on GOV.UK.

To provide additional guidance, a very clear EUSS <u>leaflet</u> has been produced by the University of Liverpool, in partnership with the Home Office. It has been designed with children in mind and is intended to support both children and parents with information to help them apply to the EUSS. A set of accompanying <u>FAQs</u> are available too. A list of organisations providing additional EUSS guidance and information is available <u>here</u>.

Applications to the EUSS are free and can be made online at <u>www.gov.uk/eusettlementscheme</u>, where you can also find out more information about how to apply. This is not something which can be done through school.

COVID-19 INFORMATION:

There remains a risk of Covid 19 closing bubbles in school. We continue to follow strict risk assessments and ask that you please take note of the following points which will help to protect the children and staff.

IMPORTANT! Please let school know if anyone in your household is self-isolating or has had a positive Covid test result using <u>covidreporting@heathfield.nottingham.sch.uk</u> so we can track and trace any close contacts or close a bubble as necessary.

The Prime Minister announced an extension to restrictions until at least 19th July. We will still be in bubbles until the end of term and it has not yet been advised if this will be the case in September. We hope not but know that we have good systems to minimise risk in school.

We need parents to ensure that if you or your child have any symptoms that a PCR test is done to enable school to make the appropriate decisions on class closures.

ALL absence should be reported to school. You can leave a message on the answer phone, call the office during school hours, or email the school at <u>admin@heathfield.nottingham.sch.uk</u> or use the covid email address above.

If you are travelling outside of the UK over the school holidays, please consider the implication of any <u>quarantine affecting your ability to comply with statutory school attendance</u>. Please inform the school office if you are leaving the UK so we are able to advise on leave of absence forms and implication for return dates.
