
Congratulations to the Parrots who achieved 97.7% attendance and have won gold, Tigers who have won silver and Flamingos who won bronze.



- 1 day off in a school week will mean that your child has only achieved 80% attendance that week?
- 5 days of absence in a 6-week half term means that your child has only achieved 83.4% for the half term!
- Attendance below 90% means that your child is in the persistent absentee category and could result in a referral to the local authority for legal action to be considered!

Contacting school on the first day of your child's absence prevents unnecessary texts or phone calls being made and avoids staff having to carry out a home visit.

Poor attendance is considered a safeguarding concern.

Please help us to get all pupils into school every day and on time!

<u>Packed Lunches, Snacks and Drinks:</u> Please note that children should only be bringing in water in their drink bottles, this ensures that any spillages can be cleaned up quickly and promotes or 'Healthy Schools Award' status. In addition, please ensure that children only bring healthy snacks to school for break time, not sweets, chocolate or crisps. Similarly, packed lunches should not contain sweets or fizzy drinks, please provide a healthy balanced lunch for your child.

Physical activity can help greatly with maintaining mental wellbeing. "Feel-good" chemicals in the brain, known as endorphins, are released by the brain during physical activity and help to improve mood, energy levels and even sleep. Together, these positive effects help to improve self-confidence and resilience. Kids who get active every day are also better sleepers.

This week we have also been looking at kindness. Studies show that kindness makes children happier, reduces stress, and improves self-esteem. Kind actions activate the joyful area of the brain, and boost well-being.

### **Covid protocols at Heathfield**

We are continuing to ensure risk assessments are being followed in school and we are regularly reminding children to wash their hands and where possible to keep their distance from others. The cold weather and return to the 'flu season' is always a tricky time of year so please look after yourselves and each other.


If your child has the typical symptoms of:

- a cough,
- loss of taste of smell or
- a high temperature

then you should take them for a PCR test and isolate.

A few of our more recent cases have continued to show the Delta variant symptoms of **flu like symptoms or a sore throat**. For peace of mind we recommend getting a PCR test if you or your child has these symptoms. As the winter season usually brings coughs and colds we do ask that you take responsibility in ensuring any such symptoms are checked out.

A negative Lateral Flow test will not enable a child to return to school earlier than the 10 day isolation period.
