Reading at home in KS1: KS1 have recently purchased a wide selection of fully decodable reading books for children to take home which will support their Read Write Inc. Phonics learning in the classroom. Over the next few weeks, your child will come home with a book that is linked to the phonics group that they are in at school. All Book Bag Books include notes for parents and carers on how to help their child at home with phonics so please read this section to help answer any questions you might have.

We will be changing these books for children regularly so it is important that your child brings their book bag every day to allow teachers to change the books as and when required. With this in mind, please ensure your child returns the book they have been given to the school as these are an expensive resource and do need to be shared with all the children in KS1. If you have any questions about the phonics books, please speak to your child's class teacher who will be happy to help. Finally, don't forget to sign your child's rainbow reading card when you have read with them!

<u>Parent Lite App</u> As a school, we always need to ensure that your contact details and your child/children's information is up to date and accurate should we need to contact you for any reason. To support this we have a convenient way for you to access, review and request changes to the data held on you and your children.

An activation email to access the parent app at your own convenience via smartphone, tablet or PC will be sent out this week. Please note that your activation email is unique to you and should not be used by anyone else. Your activation email will expire after 14 days if it is not used, please contact your school if you require a replacement after this date. If you have not received this please contact the school office so that we can check we have your correct email address on our system.

Getting started with the SIMS Parent Lite App

- 1. We will send you an activation email to the email address we have on record for you, simply click on the link from your tablet, PC or smartphone to activate your account
- 2. You can then login using your normal Facebook, Twitter, Google or Microsoft username and password
- 3. From your smartphone or tablet, download the app from the Google Play or Apple App store search for **SIMS Parent Lite**
- 4. From a PC or Windows phone, login online at www.sims-parent.co.uk



Change of menu: On Thursday, 20st January, we will be having a special Gruffalo menu. There will be 2 choices on the day: Hunters Chicken or a Vegetarian all-day breakfast.

Meals will cost £2.15 for children in Nursery and KS2 who are not in receipt of free school meals. Children in Dolphins, Foxes, Badgers and Hares will not have to pay as they are part of the government's universal free school meal scheme.

If your child is a Seahorse, please inform the office or a member of the Nursery staff of your child's dinner choice for that day. All other children can tell their teacher at morning register on Thursday.

Friday Rainbow Club: The same criteria applies for entry to Rainbow Club this half term, if your circumstances haven't changed your child will stay on the register. If your circumstances have changed and you need your child to join the club, please speak to the office. If you no longer require your child to attend and you can collect them at 12:50pm then please speak to the office and the registers can be updated. Friday is still a school day and the children receive 2 register marks. Friday attendance has dropped recently so remember your child is missing 3 hours of quality learning time if you do not bring them to school on Fridays.

<u>Uniform Reminder:</u> Over the last few weeks there have been less and less children in the correct uniform. Please remind yourself of our expectations and ensure the correct uniform is in place again by 4th January.

Please reinforce good hygiene routines at home and if you or your child are showing ANY of the typical Covid symptoms you are advised to get a PCR test asap. **Children and staff can only return to school with proof of a negative PCR test**. We want everyone to have a happy, safe and healthy Christmas break so we need to do all we can now to stop the spread of germs in the community. Your help will be greatly appreciated by everyone.

Covid protocols at Heathfield

Because of the increased risk in our school community and the changes to guidance for England we are asking anyone with symptoms to get a PCR test and self isolate until you receive the result.

Typical symptoms are:

- a cough,
- loss of taste of smell or
- a high temperature

Some new symptoms of the Omicron variant include:

- Headaches
- Night sweats
- Scratchy sore throat

A negative Lateral Flow test **will not** enable a child to return to school earlier than the 10-day isolation period but we do still recommend that these are used as an indicator for peace of mind.

Attendance: All pupils are expected to achieve the attendance target of at least 96.5%

Holidays in Term Time Will Not Be Authorised Families taking a holiday during term time are at risk of legal action and/or a Penalty Notice being issued

Congratulations to all our pupils who achieved 96% and above attendance last half term, their badges will be given out soon (certificates for our nursery children).

There will be a different colour badge to collect each half term for children with attendance between 96% - 100%.



Please remember

- It is the parents' responsibility to contact school on the first day of their child's absence
- School will attempt to contact parents by text or telephone if the reason of absence has not been reported by 9.20am
- If school has not been informed of a child's absence by the following day, then the absence will be recorded as unauthorised

Contacting school on the first day of your child's absence prevents unnecessary texts or phone calls being made and avoids staff having to carry out a home visit.

Poor attendance is considered a safeguarding concern.
