Leadership Changes at Heathfield: Yesterday you should have received a link to a letter announcing some changes to the leadership at Heathfield. After 20 highly successful years as Headteacher, Mr Fullwood will be taking early retirement at the end of this academic year. From September, following a lengthy recruitment process, governors have announced that Mr Hicks (Head of School – Scotland Road) and Miss Dickens (Head of School – Kersall Drive) will take on the role of co-headteachers of Heathfield.

What's Been Happening in School:

Year 1 & 2	In Maths this week, Y1 have been working on measuring using non-standard units. Y2 have been working on shapes; they have been arranging them into patterns and sequences as well as having a go at drawing 2D shapes. In English this week Y1 and 2 have been resilient and completed their assessments. In topic this week we designed our woodland puppets. We looked at our school in ariel view and made a 'key' recognising landmarks we have in and around our school. We also had a discussion on different situations and who could keep us safe in those situations.
Year 3 & 4	In Maths this week, Year 3 have been learning to add and subtract fractions. Year 4 have been learning to use column method multiplication using their 3, 4, 6 and 8 times tables. In English Year 3 and 4 have been learning about persuasive writing. We will be writing our own persuasive advert convincing people to buy the robot we have designed!
Year 5 & 6	All Y5&6 have demonstrated resilience this week when completing their Spring assessments in Maths, Reading, GPS (Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling) and Writing. Alongside tests, the children have finished writing their non-chronological reports about Greek Mythological creatures. In Maths, Y5 have learnt how to add and subtract fractions; they have converted their answers into improper fractions and mixed numbers. Y6s have developed their reasonings skills, to be able to answer ratio questions. In topic, the children have built and painted a model of the Parthenon – they look great! We have created abstract collages inspired by images in our Greek non-fiction book, Mythologica.

<u>KS1 TRIP TO CONKERS</u>! On Wednesday March 23rd children in **Foxes**, **Badgers** and **Hares** will be going on a trip to Conkers Adventure Park to bring their topic 'Into the Woods' to an end. We have arranged for the children to have two ranger led activities on the day and full access to the all the other

areas of the park. We will be leaving school at 9.15am and returning to school at the slightly later time of 4.30pm to allow the children to experience as much of the park as possible.

Whilst the full cost of the trip, including transport, is £16 per child, we are only asking for a parent contribution of £3 per child. You can give your consent for this trip and pay via the Schoolgateway app. If you are unable to access the app on your phone you can access can via the website <u>www.schoolgateway.com</u>

Children should come to school in school uniform with suitable outdoor shoes - preferably wellies as we will be getting muddy. As the majority of the day will be spent outside, children should also come with a warm waterproof coat. Their packed lunch should be in a rucksack they can carry. If you would like your

child to have a school packed lunch, you will be able to order this on the app when you provide your consent.

<u>Nursery:</u> If you wish to apply for a 30 hour (full-time) placement in our nursery from April 20122 you will need to apply online via the Childcare Choices Website (www.childcarechoices.gov.uk). If you are eligible you will need to bring your 11-digit code to the school office to register your interest. Full-time places will be allocated to nursery children who will have their 4th birthday between 1st September 2021 and 31stAugust 2022. Please apply as soon as possible. Full-time places are limited and will be dealt with on a first come, first served basis.






Phoneline disruption: Our incoming calls may be affected on Wednesday 16th March due to some maintenance. Please bear with us – it should only be for a short period of time during the day. Thank you.

Friday Rainbow Club: The same criteria apply for entry to Rainbow Club this half term, if your circumstances haven't changed your child will stay on the register. If your circumstances have changed and you need your child to join the club, please speak to the office. If you no longer require your child to attend and you can collect them at 12:50pm then please speak to the office and the registers can be updated. Friday is still a school day and the children receive 2 register marks. Friday attendance has dropped recently so remember your child is missing 3 hours of quality learning time if you do not bring them to school on Fridays.

Children will be offered a free breakfast and have the chance to socialise with their friends before starting the normal school day. We are, unfortunately unable to accommodate nursery children.




All children should enter the club by 8:30am. If you arrive after this time then you will have to wait until the gates open at 8:40am and drop your child off as normal. We are unable to serve breakfast after 8:30am as it takes time to tidy away before the start of school. If your child attends the paid breakfast club and you wish to change your booking with them, you must give them 2 weeks' notice of any changes.

All pupils are expected to achieve the attendance target of at least 96.5%

Attendance

Did you know that, if your child's attendance falls below 90% the following actions are likely to happen...

- Text to inform you that your child's attendance is below 90%
- Letter to state the actions if your child's attendance continues to remain below 90%
- A telephone or face to face meeting with your child's class teacher, or attendance lead
 - A meeting with the Head of School
 - Referral to Education Welfare Service

Contacting school on the first day of your child's absence prevents unnecessary texts or phone calls being made and avoids staff having to carry out a home visit.

Poor attendance is considered a safeguarding concern.

Covid protocols at Heathfield

Although there is no longer the legal requirement to self-isolate, a child with any of the main COVID-19 symptoms should order a PCR test and will not be allowed to attend school while awaiting the result or if the subsequent result is positive. Children with symptoms who do not obtain a PCR test must remain away from school. Parents/carers will still be asked to collect their child if they develop symptoms whilst at school

In these cases, children must stay away from school for 5 full days and may return after if they obtain 2 negative lateral flow test results on consecutive days, or after a total of 10 full days after the symptoms started, but only if they feel well.

The three main symptoms remain:

· a high temperature

 \cdot a new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours

• a loss or change to sense of smell or taste – this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Children should continue to attend school if they have not tested positive for COVID-19 and are well enough to do so. Children who are at home should access remote learning, therefore please inform school when your child is well enough to engage in their learning.

Furthermore, it is no longer advised that pupil close contacts need to test daily for 7 days and pupils in mainstream secondary schools will not be expected to continue taking part in regular asymptomatic testing. However, the school may be advised by our local public health team to recommend lateral flow device (LFD) tests to manage an outbreak.

Please be reassured that for most children, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness. However, at Heathfield we will continue to: observe good hand hygiene; cleaning regimes; ventilation requirements and other measures to manage the risk of transmission. Your continued support and co-operation are appreciated.
