School uniform for September: Orders for any school uniform you may require ready for September 2022 must



be ordered and paid for using the school gateway app no later than **Friday 10th June**. Any orders that are received after Friday 10th June might not be processed in time for the order to arrive before the summer holidays and you will have to purchase uniform elsewhere to ensure your child has uniform for the first day of school when we return back in September.

You will be contacted once your order has been received into school and advised of a suitable time to collect it.

Special Menu: Your child should have come home this week with a leaflet about our special menu taking place on Thursday 19th May. There will be 2 choices on the day: A chicken pitta bread pocket with wedges and salad or a Quorn sausage with mashed potato and peas. There will be no third option on this day.

Meals will cost £2.15 for children in Nursery and KS2 who are not in receipt of free school meals. Children in F2 and KS1 will not have to pay as they are part of the government's universal free school meal scheme.

Holidays in Term Time Will Not Be Authorised - Families taking a holiday during term time are at risk of legal action and/or a Penalty Notice being issued



It is the parents' responsibility to contact school on the first day of their child's absence.

School will attempt to contact parents by text or telephone if the reason of absence has not been reported by 9.20am. If school has not been informed of a child's absence by the following day, then the absence will be recorded as unauthorized. If a child is absent for 3 or more days, parents may be asked to provide medical documentation to support the number of days taken for an absence.

Contacting school on the first day of your child's absence prevents unnecessary texts or phone calls being made and avoids staff having to carry out a home visit. **Poor attendance is considered a safeguarding concern.**

Please help us to get all pupils into school every day and on time!

Covid Protocols

School guidance regarding Covid 19 has changed slightly since the Government relaxed rules. We now have an infection control risk assessment which we are following but we will continue good habits for hygiene, ventilation and cleaning in school aiming to minimise all absence from school.

Key messages:

- If your child has Covid symptoms or tests positive for Covid 19 they should stay away from school for 3 days.
- If a parent has symptoms of or tests positive for covid 19 and your child is still well then, they can attend school and you can bring them to school as the isolation rule has lapsed.

<u>Infection Control Risk Assessment statements for the attention of Parents/Carers:</u>

- When pupils have an infectious disease, they are excluded from school on medical grounds for the
 minimum period recommended as noted in the exclusion table mentioned above. Formal exclusion
 of pupils from school on medical grounds is enforceable by the Head Teacher only, acting on behalf
 of the local authority or the managers or governors of a school.
