
What's Been Happening in School:

Year 1 & 2	The year 2 children are being so resilient while working through their quizzes! In English this week Y1&2 have been working on writing a narrative on chapter two of Georges Marvelous Medicine – The Marvelous Plan. They began their plan by setting out the beginning middle and end of the chapter for their writing. In Maths Y1 have been building on their multiplication and division knowledge by making equal groups of 2, 5, 10. In Topic this week we looked at the illustrator Quinten Blake and some of his drawings we had a go at sketching some of the characters from Roald Dahls books.
Year 3 & 4	This week in English, Y3&4 have been looking at features of diaries, ready to write their diary entries next week. They are going to be writing the entries from the point of view of Jordan, the main character in our class text, The Soup Movement. We have looked at how to use emotive language, using a range of fronted adverbials and conjunctions in their writing. In Maths, Y3 have been comparing and ordering events by their duration whilst Y4 have been recapping how to tell the exact time on an analogue clock. Y4 have also completed their second multiplication test practice in preparation for the real one after half term. Just a reminder to keep practising at home on TTRS or using the Mathsframe multiplication check. In Topic, the children have been designing the packaging for their bread rolls. We are going to be making bread rolls in the last week before half term for the Community Café event. As part of the event, we are also asking families to share recipes which will be made into a recipe book for everyone to take home. The children have been sent home with a template this afternoon for you to fill in with your favourite family recipe.
Year 5 & 6	Firstly, congratulations to all the Y6 children for completing their SATs. All children demonstrated a determined and resilient attitude towards the tests – well done! In English, Y5&6 have completed their persuasive advertisements about fireworks. They have focused on including superlatives, comparatives and rhetorical questions. Whilst the Y6s have completed their SATs, the Y5s have revised shape; they created A3 posters to showcase their understanding. In topic, the children created a group presentation about the different religious beliefs of the Shang Dynasty, then taught this knowledge to the class. The children have looked at the physical features of the Himalayas, the Three Gorges and the Gobi Desert and talked about how humans have impacted these areas.

<u>Hathersage Parents/Carer Meeting</u>: On Monday 16th May, Mrs Fisher will be doing a meeting for all parents/carers of any children who have a place on the Hathersage residential. The meeting will be at 3:30pm in one of the Key Stage 1 classrooms.

Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations: On Friday 27th May we will be celebrating the Queens jubilee with a Tea Party Lunch on the playground, weather permitting (the full menu will be on next week's newsletter). Children are invited to come dressed in red, white and blue. Each phase will be running their own activities to commemorate the history of her reign and her role in the commonwealth.

Year 5&6 – Great Jubilee Bake Off: To celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, Year 5&6 are running a bake-off competition where children will be invited to bring in their themed bakes on Friday 27th May. The theme is: A Treat fit for the Queen. This could be something they think the queen might like to eat, something traditional or just something which has been decorated with the Queen in mind (think red, white and blue). Children should take their bakes into their class on the morning of Friday 27th May. The Year 5&6 staff will also be participating and children will get the chance to vote on their winner!



Special Menu: On Thursday, 19th May, we will be having a special menu. There will be 2 choices on the day: A chicken pitta bread pocket with wedges and salad or A quorn sausage with mashed potato and peas. There will be no third option on this day.

Meals will cost £2.15 for children in Nursery and KS2 who are not in receipt of free school meals. Children in Dolphins, Foxes, Badgers and Hares will not have to pay as they are part of the government's universal free school meal scheme.

- It is the parents' responsibility to contact school on the first day of their child's absence
- School will attempt to contact parents by text or telephone if the reason of absence has not been reported by 9.20am
- If school has not been informed of a child's absence by the following day, then the absence will be recorded as unauthorised
- If a child is absent for 3 or more days, parents may be asked to provide medical documentation to support the number of days taken for an absence

<u>School uniform for September</u>: Orders for any school uniform you may require ready for September 2022 must be ordered and paid for using the school gateway app no later than **Friday 10th June.** Any orders that are received after Friday 10th June might not be processed in time for the order to arrive before the summer holidays and you will have to purchase uniform elsewhere to ensure your child has uniform for the first day of school when

we return back in September. You will be contacted once your order has been received into school and advised of a suitable time to collect it.

Friday Rainbow Club: The same criteria apply for entry to Rainbow Club this half term, if your circumstances



haven't changed your child will stay on the register. If your circumstances have changed and you need your child to join the club, please speak to the office. If you no longer require your child to attend and you can collect them at 12:50pm then please speak to the office and the registers can be updated. Early Birds Breakfast Club: The club is completely free and will run every morning from 8:15am. There is no need to book a place, simply wait at the office door to be let in. Covid Protocols

School guidance regarding Covid 19 has changed slightly since the Government relaxed rules. We now have an infection control risk assessment which we are following but we will continue good habits for hygiene, ventilation and cleaning in school aiming to minimise all absence from school.

Key messages:

- If your child has covid symptoms or tests positive for Covid 19 they should stay away from school for 3 days.
- If a parent has symptoms of or tests positive for covid 19 and your child is still well then they can attend school and you can bring them to school as the isolation rule has lapsed.
- YOU MUST inform school on first day of absence on 0115 9794304

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Infection Control Risk Assessment statements for the attention of Parents/Carers:

- When pupils have an infectious disease they are excluded from school on medical grounds for the minimum period recommended as noted in the exclusion table mentioned above. Formal exclusion of pupils from school on medical grounds is enforceable by the Head Teacher only, acting on behalf of the local authority or the managers or governors of a school.
