#### What's Been Happening in School:

Year 1 & 2	Year 1 and 2 started their new text in English, Cinderboy. They have really enjoyed learning the story and thinking about the characters. In Maths, Year 1 have been comparing numbers, using the language greater than and less than. Year 2 have been comparing 2-digit numbers and practising counting forwards and backwards in 2s, 5s and 10s. In Science the children learnt about the different types of weather. We will be observing and recording the weather in Nottingham over the next few days. In Computing, the children are continuing to research puppets designs. They have practised saving their favourite images to their iPad. In D&T, the children are enjoying designing fairytale lollipop stick puppets and they are starting to make them.
Year 3 & 4	In English, Year 3&4 have been looking at the vocabulary for their setting description based on 'The Iron Man'. They have been exploring positive and negative vocabulary and writing sentences with fronted adverbials. In Maths, year 3 have been continuing to explore place value to 1000 by comparing and ordering numbers. Year 4 have been looking at Roman Numerals and ordering them in ascending and descending order. In computing, the children have been working on creating the most efficient code and debugging any issues within the code. In DT, the children have been designing their own inventions to solve a variety of everyday and worldwide issues.
Year 5 & 6	In English, Y5&6 have started writing their positive and negative descriptions of a setting (Spectrum Hall) based on The Last Wild. The children have worked hard to include expanded noun phrases, figurative language and fronted adverbials. In maths, Y5s have identified and compared negative numbers. We have looked at a variety of representations and discussed the real-life use of negative numbers. Year 6 have recently completed their place value assessment and are now moving onto the four operations – add, subtract, multiply and divide. In topic, the children have completed some learning outside of the classroom. They have identified flowering and non-flowering plants around school. Using an atlas, we have learnt about different biomes and identified them on a map of the World.

Harvest Festival: During the week of 3rd October, we will be holding our annual Harvest festival celebration and as in previous years, we will be supporting the Bestwood and Bulwell foodbank. We are asking families to make a small donation of nonperishable foods to the foodbank to help other families that are in need. If your child would like to bring a donation, can these please be brought in to school and given to class teachers by Friday 7th October.





<u>Polite Request</u>: Please ensure that you do not send your child to school with products containing nuts, including chocolate spread. We have a number of children with severe nut allergies which means we must keep Heathfield Primary a **NUT FREE ZONE**.



<u>Goose Fair Menu</u>: On Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> October we will be having a special Goose Fair menu in place of the usual school meal.

### Children with Special Medical diets will be accommodated.

All children in Foundation and KS1 will be ordered a school meal under the universal infant free school meals scheme. KS2 Children: the cost for a dinner is £2.25 unless your child is entitled to free school meals. Nursery full time children: the cost for a dinner is £2.15.

<u>Reception to Year 6 Flu Vaccinations – Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> October:</u> It is now time for your child's yearly flu nasal spray! The free seasonal flu spray is offered to all children and young people in Reception and Year 1-Year 6 classes. Even if your child received this last year it is recommended, they have it again this year or they won't be protected. It is more important than ever to reduce the number of those becoming ill with flu this winter to help protect them and the NHS.



You must complete one online consent form for each of your children. It is important every child has a completed form which states if you would like them to receive the flu vaccination spray or not. The online consent form can be found through this link https://www.nottinghamshireimmunisations.co.uk/Forms/Flu

The school code for Scotland Campus is NG122442S. Online consent will close at 3pm the working day before vaccination session.

If you decide you want to withdraw consent you must email sais@nottshc.nhs.uk at least 24 hours before our school vaccination session is due. **Please note:** If any of the following happen after completing this form you must contact the School Aged Immunisation Service: if your child becomes wheezy, has a bad attack of asthma, has started steroid tablets for asthma or has had this vaccination anywhere else.
