What's Been Happening in School:

Year 1 & 2	This week in English we have been using our text map to retell the story of 'Cinderboy'. Today we published our finished story. The children have been so resilient! In Maths, Year 1 have been using part-part whole models, focusing on addition to 10. Year 2 have been focusing on fact families and securing knowledge of addition facts to 20. In Science, the children have been learning about autumn. We even went on an autumn walk around the school grounds, spotting signs of autumn. In RE we have been focusing on friendships and what makes a good friend. We linked this to 'The Good Samaritan' story and discussed the most important part of the story. We have also been practising using the iPad to record videos, in preparation for recording our fairytale puppet shows.
Year 3 & 4	In English this week, Year 3 & 4 have been writing a setting description based on 'The Iron Man'. The children worked hard to include expanded noun phrases, fronted adverbials and rhetorical questions. In Maths, Year 3 have been counting in 50s, 100s, 4s and 8s as well as interpreting data in tables on. Year 4 have been looking at rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. In DT, the children had a great time designing, creating and evaluating their own bin bag clothes. In Science, we have been learning about where sound comes from and about the life of Albert Einstein.
Year 5 & 6	In English, Y5&6 have finished writing our positive and negative descriptions. The children spent a lesson at the end of the week publishing their writing, ensuring they were focusing on their presentation. In maths, Y5 have learnt how to round to up to 1,000,000 and have been very resilient in their approach. The Y6s have learnt about factors and multiples. In Science, the children have created a lifecycle of their chosen animal and have dissected a lily to learn about the male and female parts of a plant. In art, we have used oil pastels to create our final piece – animal eyes.

<u>Thank You!</u>: As you may be aware, Heathfield received its first Ofsted inspection since 2016 on Tuesday and Wednesday this week. The inspection was incredibly thorough and we will share the final report with you once we have received it. The pupils were great and exemplified every aspect of our Heathfield pledge over the two days. We would both like to thank all the parents and pupils who replied to the online surveys, the responses were overwhelmingly positive and it was great to see that 100% of those who replied (99 people responded) said that their child was happy at school and 94% would recommend Heathfield to another parent.

Reception to Year 6 Flu Vaccinations –Unfortunately we had to move the date to Tuesday 1st November: If you have already completed the form, there is no need for you to complete it again.

The free seasonal flu spray is offered to all children and young people in Reception and Year 1-Year 6 classes. Even if your child received this last year it is recommended, they have it again this year or they won't be protected. It is more important than ever to reduce the number of those becoming ill with flu this winter to help protect them and the NHS.



You must complete one online consent form for each of your children. It is important every child has a completed form which states if you would like them to receive the flu vaccination spray or not. The online consent form can be found through this link https://www.nottinghamshireimmunisations.co.uk/Forms/Flu

The school code for Scotland Campus is NG122442S. Online consent will close at 3pm the working day before vaccination session.

If you decide you want to withdraw consent you must email sais@nottshc.nhs.uk at least 24 hours before our school vaccination session is due. The nasal spray may not be suitable for some children, for more information visit www.nhs.uk/child-flu or pick up a leaflet from the school office.

Please note: If any of the following happen after completing this form you must contact the School Aged Immunisation Service: if your child becomes wheezy, has a bad attack of asthma, has started steroid tablets for asthma or has had this vaccination anywhere else.
