What's Been Happening in School:

Year 1 & 2	This week in English Key Stage 1 started their new text, Lost and Found. They have started learning the story using a text map to help them. They also wrote some sentences to describe the character and setting. Next week the children will start writing the story. In Maths Year 1 focused on subtraction this week. They used ten frames and counters to subtract practically. Year 2 have been developing their addition and subtraction skills. They used number lines to add and subtract 2-digit numbers and ones. In Science, we started our new topic. We learnt about the different animal groups such as mammals, reptiles, fish and amphibians. In Geography we labelled the 5 continents and 7 oceans. We used songs to help us. Year 1 enjoyed completing a range of exciting activities for their Night Light on Tuesday. Year 2 enjoyed a visit from staff at Nottingham University ahead of their trip next week.
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Year 3 & 4 This week Year 3&4 had a wonderful trip to Creswell Crags. We really enjoyed learning about different aspects of life during the stone age. To learn how to survive in the stone age we were taught how to build shelters, start a fire and how to throw a spear. The children were able to look at the different bones of different stone age animals and put them together into a skeleton. We explored the caves that people would have lived in thousands of years ago! In English, the children have been planning their narrative based on our class book 'The Wild Way Home'. We made predictions about the story and created our own story mountains. In Maths, Year 3 have been adding and subtracting 1-digit numbers from 3-digit numbers. Year 4 have been using the column method to add 4-digit numbers, both with and without regrouping. In Art, the children have used charcoal to create some wonderful cave drawings.

Year 5 & 6

This week, Y5&6 have been introduced to their Summer Shakespeare text – Twelfth Night. After reading the text, the children loved participating in drama activities. This included putting themselves into the character's shoes and acting as they would, analysing the text and recreating a scene from the play. To help summarise key themes from the play, our P4C (Philosophy for Children) discussion focused on identity and whether it is ever ok to pretend to be someone else. In our English lessons, we have looked at our new text, The Peculiars, which is set in Victorian London. We have considered the thoughts and feelings of the main character (Sheba), as she is known as 'wolf girl' and is part of a 'freak' sideshow. In maths, Y5s have learnt how to add two 4-digit numbers together using column addition. We then looked at how to solve addition problems with missing digits. In Y6, the children learnt different strategies for completing multiplication and long division problems.

<u>Year 2 Visit to University of Nottingham:</u> We are excited to share details of our first educational visit this year for our Year 2 children to The University of Nottingham. The trip will be taking place on **Monday 7th November 2022.** We will be travelling via tram directly to the University campus and will be back in the afternoon in time for a normal collection from school. There will be no charge for this trip.

We would like you to use the schoolgateway app to give consent for your child to attend the trip and to order your child's school packed lunch.

<u>Victorian Day</u>: On Tuesday 8th November, Y5&6 will be having a Victorian Theme day! You may wish to come dressed up as a Victorian in order to feel truly a part of this special event! Not to give too much away, but expect to experience some Victorian schooling, Victorian TEACHERS, and even Victorian food...

<u>A Sad Goodbye</u>: Unfortunately, we will be saying goodbye to some our wonderful staff at Christmas. It's always sad when people move on and they will all be VERY much missed but we wish them all the best for their future life beyond Heathfield. We will be saying goodbye to Christine and Sandra (it had to happen at some point!) who between them have worked at Heathfield for more years than they would probably want to admit to and who have been a part of the Heathfield experience for thousands of pupils.

Year 5&6 visit to the Black Country Museum: As part of our Victorians topic next half term, we will be visiting the Black Country museum in Dudley on Thursday 24th November! In order to make the most of the visit (with it being quite a drive), we need pupils to please be at school for 8:10 to leave at 8:15. Furthermore, we will be departing from the museum at around 14:15 which means we will be back at school later than the usual 3:15. We estimate this time to be around 4-4:15, but we will send updates via text on our ETA during the journey back.

For this trip we are asking for a voluntary contribution of £5. This contributes to the cost of the coach, the visit to the museum, a workshop and a show.

Thank you to any parents who have volunteered to accompany the children on the trip. We still need 3 more helpers, please speak to your child's teacher or the school office if you would be willing go.

<u>Reception Classes</u>: On Thursday 8th December 2022, Dolphins and Whales are going to go to see Goldilocks and the Three Bears at the Nottingham Playhouse. This trip should cost over £20 per child. However, we are only asking for a £3 voluntary contribution per child and school will fund the rest.

We do have some adult places available. If you would like to come with us we are asking for a £5 adult contribution. These places are limited so if you would like to come, please give your name to the office. If we have too many adult volunteers, we will pull names out of a hat to make sure it is fair!

Attendance Incentives!

Attendance was brilliant this week, but it can be even better! We want to celebrate good attendance with some exciting incentives!



<u>Attendance Reminders:</u> Parents will be required to contact the school office via telephone or text message on the first day of their child's absence – they will be expected to provide an explanation and in some cases, provide medical evidence for the absence.

Can we politely ask that medical or dental appointments are made outside of school hours. Where this is not possible and appointments need to be made during school hours, parents will be expected to provide proof of appointments (appointment cards, letters, texts, emails etc.) to obtain approval for their child's absence to attend such appointments. Parents will be responsible for ensuring their child misses only the amount of time necessary to attend the appointment.

<u>Positive Mental Health and Well-Being at Heathfield:</u> This half term we have been focusing on our well-being area of 'BE Active'

This week we have launch our "Be Active" area of well-being.

Being active is for people of all ages and does not need to be intense physical activity. Being active can also encourage social interactions and build connections. Joining in with activities such as football, netball, tag and basketball also helps you to get along with others and learn to work well as a team.

Why not share some activities you enjoy with your children to be active together – from taking a walk or cycle through the park, to swimming or climbing trees, play is a great way to have fun and keep fit!

<u>Midday Supervisor Vacancies</u>: We have Midday Supervisor vacancies across both of our campuses working for one hour and 25 minutes per day between 11:30am and 1:30pm.
