What's Been Happening in School:

Year 1 & 2	In English, Year 1 and Year 2 have been writing some fantastic non-chronological reports about Christmas traditions around the world. The children aimed to use the conjunctions 'and' and 'because' in their sentences again. In Maths, Year 1 have been creating fact families using addition facts . Year 2 have been drawing tens and ones to add and subtract two 2-digit numbers with exchanging. In the afternoons the children have been taking part in quizzes to assess their knowledge of their learning this half term. The children all took part in their Christmas productions this week and did a fantastic job!
Year 3 & 4	In English, Year 3 & 4 have completed their newspaper reports on the Wild Way Home. The children worked hard to include all aspects of the checklist, such as fronted adverbials for time, direct and indirect speech. In Maths, Year 3 have started their unit on multiplication and have been using arrays to represent the calculations. Year 4 have consolidated their knowledge on multiplication and division by answering problem solving questions. In Science, we have been making our own sedimentary rock, using chocolate and jelly to represent the different layers of sediment. We are looking forward to tasting our rocks next week! The children have been busy practising their songs for the winter fair and are looking forward to singing them to you all this afternoon.
Year 5 & 6	In English, Y5&6 have completed research about Queen Victoria to help write a biography about her. We have practiced how to use relative clauses to add additional information and how to use passive voice to make our writing sound more formal. In Maths, Y5s have learnt how to multiply and divide by 10, 100 and 1000. In Friday maths, the children have also looked at how to work out the missing angle on a straight line. The Y6s have continued their work on fractions, by looking at how to work out the fraction of an amount – they have learnt that their times table knowledge is imperative! In Science, we have created circuits to investigate if the brightness of a bulb or the sound of buzzer is affected by the voltage of a battery. Using their knowledge of creating circuits, the children have created a wire loop game.
