What's Been Happening in School:

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Year 1 & 2	In English Year 1 and 2 have been using various images of characters and settings to create descriptive sentences. We also created our own story based on an underwater image. It was a great way to see our previous learning being put into action. In Maths, the Year 1s have been consolidating their learning in place value to 10 and addition/subtraction within 10. We have completed our arithmetic and reasoning quiz and the teachers are pleased with the effort the children have put in to these. In Year 2 the children have been looking at money, adding pounds and pence and making amounts using coins and notes. In our topic lessons we have started our DT project for the half term. We were looking at bridges around the world. We learnt the difference between a suspension bridge, arch bridge and a beam bridge. In RE we started to learn about Passover and how the Jewish community celebrate this.
Year 3 & 4	In English, Year 3 and 4 have begun looking at what instructional texts are and how they differ from other types of writing. They have explored formal and informal language and how to use formal language effectively and have been studying the features of a set of instructions ready to write their own! In Maths, the Year 3s have been continuing to use their knowledge of arrays to multiply and
Year 5 & 6	Another busy start to the term for Years 5 & 6. In English, we have started to build up our ideas to write a balanced argument about Organ Donation. This links to our class book – Pig Heart Boy – in which a young boy is considering a Pig's heart in order to survive. In maths, Year 5s have been learning the long multiplication method to multiply by 2-digit numbers; give them a question at home to test them! Year 6 have started their decimal unit checking understanding of what a decimal is and how to order, compare and use them within calculations. We have started our new topic – Bodies – and have been looking at the theory of Evolution in Science. Jaguars have started their swimming lessons and Lions and Tigers have been working to improve stamina in our Indoor Fitness topic for PE this half term.

<u>Special Winnie-the-Pooh Menu</u>: We will be having a special menu on Thursday 19th January. There will be no third choice on this day.

Every fulltime child in the school can participate in this event. Children with special dietary requirements will be catered for. Don't forget that all children in Dolphins, Foxes, Badgers and Hares classes get free school meals under the Universal Free School Meal entitlement. This is currently available to them until the end of Yr2. For full time nursery the cost for the meal will be £2.20 children and for children in years 3, 4, 5 and 6 the cost for the meal will be £2.25 unless your child is entitled to Free School Meals. This should be paid using the schoolgateway app.

Free School Meals: Parents and carers could save up to £437 per year by checking if their child is eligible for free school meals. All primary school children in reception, year one and year two are entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals, free for all children in Government funded schools.

If you receive benefits, your children may be entitled to continue having Free School Meals after year two. Please check your eligibility and apply here: https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals

<u>Nut Free snacks and Packed Lunches</u>: Please ensure that you do not send your child to school with products containing nuts, including chocolate spread. We have a number of children with severe nut allergies which means we must keep Heathfield a **NUT FREE ZONE**.

Invacuation Practice: At school we hold regular fire drills to practice evacuating the building in an emergency. Schools are now required to practice invacuation procedures so that we are prepared for any event in the community that should require all children to be brought into school quickly and the building secured. This will be signaled through the sound of a klaxon We appreciate that practicing such a procedure will be new for our pupils and may cause them to ask questions. We would like to reassure you that we will handle this in the most appropriate manner to try and limit the impact on the children. We hope, that by practicing invacuations on a more regular basis, the pupils will become accustomed to the process. We hope that by letting parents/carers know in

advance of us carrying out an invacuation drill, you will be able to reassure your children should they come home with any concerns.

It will be a relaxed screening with some lights on & the volume reduced.


