#### What's Been Happening in School:

Year 5 & 6	As usual, another busy week for Y5/6! All children have worked their socks off in their reading, GPS and maths assessments; we are so very proud of all of them! In English, each class has been finishing off their balanced arguments debating whether you should sign up to the organ donation register or not. We have read more chapters of our class book and have been discussing how Cameron must be feeling to receive a pig's heart! In science, we have been looking at Evolution. Jaguars and Tigers have been creating their very own fossils using salt dough and shells (Lions – you'll get chance to do this very soon!). In RE, we have been debating 'is anything truly eternal?' and what the truth really means. To do this, we have been respectfully challenging other people's ideas. What do you think?
Year 3 & 4	In English, Year 3 and 4 have been writing a set of instructions for how to survive a volcanic eruption. They researched two infamous eruptions; Mount Vesuvius in Pompeii 79 CE and the eruption of Mount St Helens in America in 1980. Both Year 3 and 4 have been completing their assessments in Maths. The children have worked very hard and show excellent resilience in their assessments. The teachers are very proud of them! This week Parrots Class started to design their own volcano in DT and are very excited to make it next week! Toucans investigated the weight of gas in Science and Flamingos begun to paint their own Hokusai wave in art.
Year 1 & 2	history. We discussed our own dreams for the future and wrote some ideas down. Year 1s have started to look at numbers from 10-15 this week and have been making them using base 10. In Year 2 maths we have been making different amounts of money using coins. In our topic sessions we have continued to look at bridges. This week we designed our own bridge in preparation for making it in the next few weeks! We have decided to make beam bridges but also know the difference between suspension and arch bridges too. In PSHE we have been talking about how to respond to different situations and whether they are safe or unsafe.

<u>Free School Meals:</u> Parents and carers could **save up to £437** per year by checking if their child is eligible for free school meals. <u>Nut Free snacks and Packed Lunches</u>: Please ensure that you do not send your child to school with products containing nuts, including chocolate spread. We have a number of children with severe nut allergies which means we must keep Heathfield a **NUT FREE ZONE**.

Invacuation Practice: At school we hold regular fire drills to practice evacuating the building in an emergency. Schools are now required to practice invacuation procedures so that we are prepared for any event in the community that should require all children to be brought into school quickly and the building secured. This will be signaled through the sound of a klaxon We appreciate that practicing such a procedure will be new for our pupils and may cause them to ask questions. We would like to reassure you that we will handle this in the most appropriate manner to try and limit the impact on the children. We hope, that by practicing invacuations on a more regular basis, the pupils will become accustomed to the process. We hope that by letting parents/carers know in advance of us carrying out an invacuation drill, you will be able to reassure your children should they come home with any concerns.

It will be a relaxed screening with some lights on & the volume reduced.


