**Attendance is not good.** We have too many children missing school regularly for unauthorised reasons. Our Attendance Team meet regularly with the Education Welfare Officer and discuss high priority cases. Poor attendance is a Safeguarding concern when there are no valid reasons for the absence. As parents you have a legal duty to ensure your child has good attendance. This is 95% or above which only equates to around 5 days off in a whole school year. Poor attendance is having a negative impact on some children's progress and attainment.


