The Year 4s have been working with the Nottingham Music Hub music teachers all year to learn cello, viola or violin. 	Year 3 and 4 have had a lovely week despite it being short! Falcons and Pelicans had fantastic trips to Green's Windmill and learnt all about how the mill works. In English, we have started planning a Setting Description about Sherwood Forest which we will be writing up next week and the week after!
<b>Year 5 &amp; 6</b>	This week in Year 5 and 6 we have been continuing with our topic Mexico and South America. The Year 6's have had an amazing time on their residential to London, they've been on the London eye, a river cruise and visited lots of museums! At school, we have been learning about area and perimeter and have made an exploding book based on our topic Mexico and South America. The Year 5's have had a wonderful time going on a theatre trip to Nottingham's Theatre Royal, where the children have watched a show of the Twelfth Night. Ten children from Year 5 had the wonderful honour of getting to perform on the stage!

### **YEARS 3 AND 4 RSE:**

Year 3&4 RSE: Next week, the children will be taking part in their third RSE lessons. The children will be split into Year 3 and Year 4 groups to take part in these lessons. We will also be including a review lesson at the end in which boys and girls will be taught separately and given the opportunity to ask any questions or review any of the subject matter they have been taught

Year 3 will complete two sessions:

- They will learn about puberty changes to boys and girls, including the menstrual cycle and that this happens as they are growing into adults.
- They will learn about basic first aid and why it is so important.

Year 4 will complete two sessions:

- They will learn about safe secrets and unsafe secrets and how they would make us feel. They will consider who they could talk to that could help them with this.
- They will learn about marriage and civil partnerships, why people choose to have them and what the legal ages are in the UK.
