Year 5 and 6 follow on Children can choose to continue with additional music lessons on the violin, viola, cello or guitar. These take place after school with outside providers giving small group tuition, the costs are covered by the school. Instruments to be used during these lessons are also provided by the school.

Other musical performance opportunities at Heathfield

CHOIR

Key Stage 2 children who love to sing are all invited to choir. The school annually performs at the Young Voices Concert in Sheffield Arena and at the singing in the City Christmas events.

WEEKLY ASSEMBLIES

AREA BAND

A city wide orchestra for Year 4 pupils as well as those doing follow on music lessons in Year 5 and 6. There are weekly practice sessions, half termly rehearsals with other schools and termly concerts.

Can my child sit musical exams?

Some children in the follow on groups will be invited to sit grades in Year 6. The music tutors will decide if this option will suit the child and will only be pursued if the child wants to. Costs of exams are covered by the school.

Can my child practise at school?

A space for children to practise within school will be provided for one lunch time a week. Any Year 4– Year 6 child is welcome to use this practice space. In addition Year 5 and 6 children will practise before their lessons.

How can my child practise at home?

Children in follow on tuition, can borrow an instrument from school to practise over the weekend. This requires the signing of a lease agreement with the parent or guardian of the child. The Nottingham Music Hub offers other opportunities to loan a range of instruments here:
