This Week...

Year 3 and 4 had a fantastic time at Warwick Castle on Monday. From watching a Falcon show to learning about crime and punishment in the Tudor period, they were eager to learn and focused on enrichment. In English, we have been planning to write a recount of their trip and all of the activities they took part in. In History, we have created the Tudor family tree and learnt about Henry VIII and his six wives. In PE, we have been creating our own dances around the theme 'Spy' and have been learning to dribble effectively in Football. In RE, we have started looking at Christmas and what it means to Christians.
