NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe' programme



We are pleased to inform you that we are participating in the **NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. Programme** this term. Speak out. Stay safe. is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline.

This child friendly programme is aligned with the curriculum and consists of age appropriate virtual assemblies and supporting classroom based activities which we have reviewed. The content is delivered in an engaging and interactive way with the help of the NSPCC mascot Buddy. If you would like to know more about the *Speak out*. Feedback survey for pupils aged 7-11

The NSPCC would like to gather feedback from pupils aged between 7-11 about the *Speak out. Stay safe'* programme to gauge their learning. This will be voluntary and children can still take part in the programme if they don't take part in the survey.

- All survey questions are multiple choice and focussed on the programme.
- The survey is anonymous and confidential. However, if in the process of completing the survey, a teacher becomes concerned for a pupil's welfare (e.g., through something a pupil says) we will follow our school's safeguarding procedures.
- If you do not want your child to take part in the <u>survey</u>, please let the office know by Friday 8th December
- If you have agreed that your child can take part in the survey but your child changes their mind on the day that is also okay.

Positive Mental Health and Well-Being

This half term we are focusing on our well-being area of BE Active.



KIDS ARE MADE TO PLAY

Physical activity can help greatly with maintaining mental wellbeing. "Feel-good" Chemicals in the brain, known as endorphins, are released by the brain during physical activity and help to improve mood, energy levels and even sleep. Together, these positive effects help to improve self-confidence and resilience. Kids who get active every day are also better sleepers.

We are encouraging our pupils to always be kind in their play. Studies show that kindness makes children happier, reduces stress, and improves self-esteem. Kind actions activate the joyful area of the brain, and boost well-being.



EYFS

This Week...

In F1 this week we have been learning about day time and the different things we might see in the day time and night time. We have talked about our morning routines, and understood how we keep ourselves clean and healthy in the morning. In F2, we have begun to use the story "Shark in the Dark" by Nick Sharratt to learn about shadows. We have been learning to retell the story using our own actions.

Next week...

In F1 we will begin to use the story Dear Santa by Eric Campbell to learn about the importance of giving gifts. We will find some presents wrapped up and have to decide what is inside. In F2 we will continue to practice retelling the story Shark in the Dark and will innovate it to make our own version of the story.

KS1

This Week...

In English Year 1 started to imitate the story 'Lost In the Toy Museum' using their text maps to help them remember each part of the story. They also tried to use some of the new interesting vocabulary they had learnt linked with this book like museum, register and theatre. Year 2 began writing their innovated versions of the story changing characters and events- we have really enjoyed reading the changes they have made to them! Great work Year 2!

In Maths our Year 1 children have been consolidating their learning of addition. They have then used this knowledge to work out some pretty tricky addition word problems. Well done Year 1 you've had great resilience! Year 2 started the week by adding and subtracting 10s, before having a go at subtracting a 1-digit number from a 2-digit number crossing a 10. Hundred squares have been a really useful resource this week.

Year 3/4

This Week...

We have been busy learning about poetry and planning a poem about Henry VIII. We are including onomatopoeias and similes. Ask your child if you can tell you some examples! In Year 3 Maths, we have been learning how to subtract using the written method, exchanging in more than one place value. in Year 4, we have been learning times table and division facts. We are all learning more about life in Tudor times, creating Keynote presentations.
