School Milk Scheme

School milk is free for under-5s and for Children in Reception and Key Stage 1 who are in receipt of free school meals.

Each child that registers with Cool Milk will receive a 189ml portion of semi-skimmed milk every day, delivered fresh and chilled to the classroom. Their school milk will not only provide them with essential nutrients, but as it is rehydrating and energy boosting it also bridges the gap between breakfast and lunch to help children stay focused. New Maths Tests

We thoroughly enjoyed our trip and we would like to send a huge thank you to our adult helpers for joining us. To quote children during the trip ... "This is the best day ever!". We have had such a brilliant first half term and we teachers are so proud of the children and how well they have settled in to Key Stage 1.

Next half term...

we will be learning all about Explorers. Look out for our topic overview and creative homework sheets for more information.

Year 3/4

This Week...

we made our tasty falafel and hummus wraps, yum! We followed clear instructions and used our newly learnt slicing and cutting skills. We have come to the end of our Ancient Egyptian topic, finishing off pieces of topic work and reading the rest of our key text, The Heart Scarab. This week we have all been celebrating Black History, examining the Windrush. We specifically thought about why people came over to the UK, how they might have felt and what happened once they arrived. Ask your child about some of the barriers faced by Windrush Generation.

Next half term...

We will be learning about 'Natural Disasters' including volcanoes and earthquakes. Your child should have gone home with the new topic overview and knowledge organiser. Please ask your child's class teacher if you have not received it.

Year 5/6

This Week...

Year5&6 have enjoyed their Black History Learning this week. They revisited the Windrush which they have learnt about before, and tested their memories of the events by creating their own quiz for others to have a go at. They also created posters inspired by those of the time that called people from the Caribbean to come and help with the new national services Britain was putting into place (such as the NHS). Leave of Absence and Unauthorised absence

Changes from August 19th

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

As you know, attendance is a high priority at Heathfield and greater emphasis has been placed on it by the government. Firstly, I'd like to thank you for ensuring we have good level of attendance.

I would like to highlight new statutory attendance guidance from the Department for Education which comes into effect from the 19th August, 2024.

Key Changes

Five Consecutive days

Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for Term Time leave of 5 or more consecutive days, inset training days are school days and can be included in the 5 or more consecutive days where there was intent to be absent for term time leave.

Ten *e**ion* (or 5 day*) of unauthori*ed ab*ence in a ten-week period

Penalty Notice fines will be considered when there have been 10 sessions (or 5days) of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time leave of irregular attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days

Second Offence (Within 3 years)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days

Third Offence and Any Further Offence: (within 3 year:)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parents future DBS certificate, due to a 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time leave or irregular attendance.

NEW FOREST PARENTING PROGRAMME



It also represents the first line of treatment and support for primary-aged children.
