Head Lice – Important Reminder

Please **check your child's hair regularly** and treat it if you spot any signs of head lice. Combs and treatments are available from pharmacies or supermarkets, or you could try this method:

Wet Combing for Head Lice and Nits

Head lice and nits can be effectively removed using **wet combing**.

What You Need:

- A fine-toothed detection comb (available online or from pharmacies)
- Ordinary shampoo
- Any type of conditioner

Steps to Wet Comb:

- 1. Wash the hair with shampoo.
- 2. Apply lots of conditioner to the hair.
- Use the detection comb to comb through the entire head of hair from roots to ends.
- 4. Comb thoroughly, section by section.
- 5. Repeat the process to ensure no lice are missed.

Timing:

Short hair: ~10 minutes

Long, frizzy, or curly hair: ~20-30 minutes

Treatment Schedule:

- Day 1, 5, 9, and 13: Wet comb to remove lice and any newly hatched nits.
- **Day 17:** Check again to ensure the hair is lice-free.

This systematic method helps to catch lice at every stage of their life cycle.

Unfortunately, it is not possible to guarantee and enforce an allergen-free environment as we cannot monitor all packed lunches and food that comes into school.


However, if you child brings a packed lunch to school, please consider what goes into it as we want to minimise risk as much as possible.

When making your child's packed lunch, please consider how balanced or healthy it is. Whilst we wouldn't want to dictate what is in a child's packed lunch, share packets of crisps, chocolate bars or bags of sweets are clearly not appropriate for a school packed lunch. Children should also only bring in water to drink with their packed lunch and throughout the day.

For a break time snack, children can bring in a piece of fruit. Crisps, chocolate or anything else is not appropriate for a morning snack.

Leave of Absence and Unauthorised absence

Changes from August 19th

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

As you know, attendance is a high priority at Heathfield and greater emphasis has been placed on it by the government. Firstly, I'd like to thank you for ensuring we have good level of attendance.

I would like to highlight new statutory attendance guidance from the Department for Education which comes into effect from the 19th August. 2024.

Key Change:

Five Consecutive days

Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for Term Time leave of 5 or more consecutive days, inset training days are school days and can be included in the 5 or more consecutive days where there was intent to be absent for term time leave.

Ten *e**ion* (or 5 day*) of unauthori*ed ab*ence in a ten-week period

Penalty Notice fines will be considered when there have been 10 sessions (or 5days) of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time leave of irregular attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days

Second Offence (Within 3 years)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days

Third Offence and Any Further Offence: (within 3 year:)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parents future DBS certificate, due to a 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time leave or irregular attendance.
