This Week...

F2 have been learning about poetry. We have found signs of spring all over school and used them to create our own spring poems. We have looked closely at daffodils and thought how we can describe them. We have been finding pairs of numbers that make 6,7,8 and 9 in maths using a variety of different manipulatives.

F1 have been reading the story of Peely Wally by Kali Stileman. We have made our own Peely Wally chicks and experimented with different sized eggs to find out how they roll down ramps, like the egg rolls away in the story.

## **Year 1/2**

#### This Week...

we have begun our new book - Goldilocks and the three Crocodiles! The children have really enjoyed immersing themselves in the story and looking at the similarities and differences to the traditional tale. In maths, year 2 have covered their 2 times tables by doubling and halving numbers. Year 1 have been looking at Place Value to 50. We have looked at representing numbers and grouping numbers below 50. We have also taken our exciting trip to the Tropical Butterfly House! The children loved the educational session about animal senses and learning all about the different animal habitats we could see. We had an absolutely amazing time and we would like to thank you for all of your ongoing support.

#### Next week...

we will be completing lots of work during Science Week! We are covering the theme 'Change and Adapt' and will be taking part in experiments throughout the week.

## **Year 3/4**

#### This Week...

has been packed full of exciting activities for our children. Peacocks and Falcons at Kersall Drive had a visit from Dave at the local church to talk about the Easter Story. To compliment our RE curriculum, the Year 4's got hands-on making lego scenes of the story, then shared them with the class. Many of our Year 4's went to their residential to Hagg Farm on Wednesday. They participated in many adventurous activities, shared time with their friends and, for some, experienced their very first sleepover away from home. Not to be outdone, the remaining Year 4's in school enjoyed activities learning outside the classroom, being creative with arts and crafts and joined in team-building activities.

## **Year 5/6**

**This Week...** Y5&6 have been busy this week with lots of practical activities! Y6 have ramped up their SATs revision by doing some paired reasoning tests in maths, and breaking down reading papers to see how to answer the different types of questions. # Leave of Absence and Unauthorised absence

Changes from August 19th

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

As you know, attendance is a high priority at Heathfield and greater emphasis has been placed on it by the government. Firstly, I'd like to thank you for ensuring we have good level of attendance.

I would like to highlight new statutory attendance guidance from the Department for Education which comes into effect from the <u>19th August</u>, <u>2024</u>.

## Key Change:

## Five Consecutive days

Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for Term Time leave of 5 or more consecutive days, inset training days are school days and can be included in the 5 or more consecutive days where there was intent to be absent for term time leave.

## Ten \*e\*\*ion\* (or 5 day\*) of unauthori\*ed ab\*ence in a ten-week period

Penalty Notice fines will be considered when there have been 10 sessions (or 5days) of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period

## First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time leave of irregular attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days

## Second Offence (Within 3 years)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days

## Third Offence and Any Further Offence: (within 3 year:)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parents future DBS certificate, due to a 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time leave or irregular attendance.


